

Traits of Safety Leaders

Leadership is not about the attributes of an individual, but rather an individual's behaviors. Just because someone is not charismatic does not mean that they cannot be a safety leader. Safety leaders exhibit a variety of behaviors that, often unintentionally, influence coworkers to improve safety performance, such as:

- Being an example, by knowing and following the rules
- Avoiding complacency for the dangers of the job
- Reporting safety hazards, violations and incidents
- Maintaining open communication with coworkers and management about safety concerns
- Implementing change to improve safety and working conditions
- Encouraging coworkers to exhibit safe behaviors
- Showing coworkers small tokens of appreciation for a safe job well done
- Making coworkers aware that unsafe behavior is unacceptable
- Being involved in safety initiatives and committees
